Re: January 2013 Management Report/Quick Reference

This is a snapshot of significant events, issues and activities that occurred within the Police Department during the month of January. Listed below are some highlights of these items. You may find more in-depth information within the complete management report that will be distributed later this month. If there are any issues, please contact me or one of the Division Commanders.

- The Department participated in the State of Arkansas’ holiday DWI mobilization that began on December 14th and extended through the New Year’s holiday. All efforts within this program targeted impaired and intoxicated drivers. The Department’s efforts were funded from the DWI & STEP Grant and resulted in numerous contacts and physical arrests for violation of the State’s impaired driving laws.
- In conjunction with the District Court Clerk’s Office, the Department began efforts to administer the annual warrant amnesty program on January 14th. This program allows those who have outstanding warrants to appear at the Bi State and schedule a court appearance without the need for incarceration in the jail. This program will continue through March 28th.
- The Department administered the Civil Service Test to two groups of potential candidates for employment during the month of January. This test was administered under the guidelines contained within the Civil Service Commission’s emergency clause hiring protocol.
- The Department hosted the regional domestic terrorism advisory council training course which was presented by the US Attorney’s Office. This training provided first responders with updated information which is critical during any response to a domestic terrorism episode. Several officers from the Department attended this training.

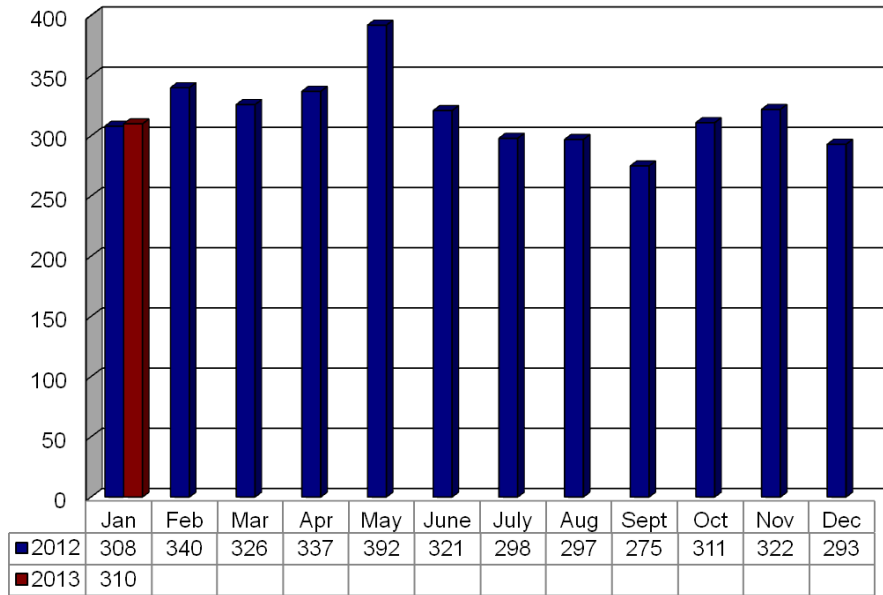

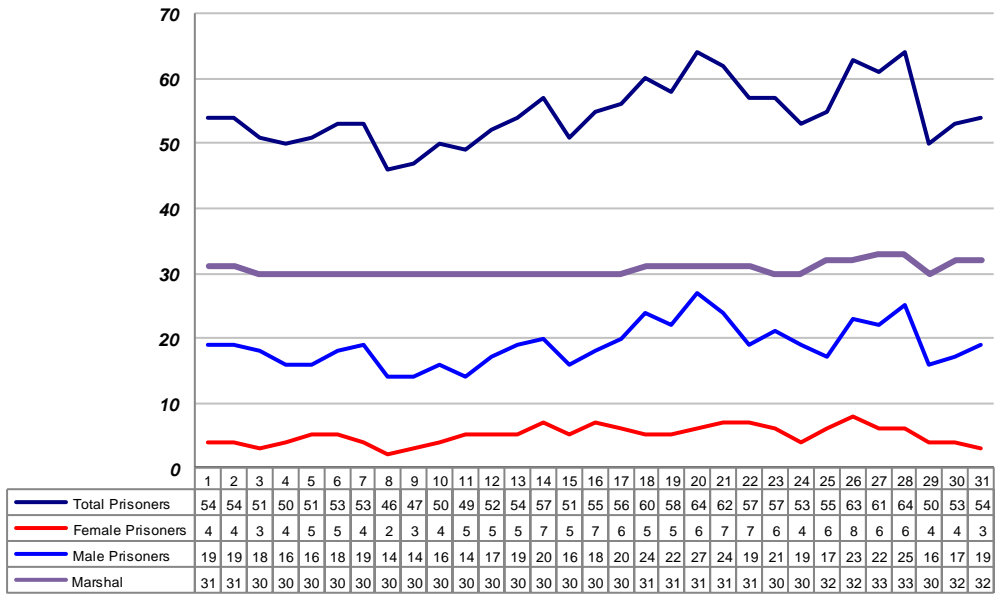

Priority 1 – Urgent Requests for assistance from Fire, EMS, or Police

Priority 2 – Accident with Injuries, Bank Robbery, Burglary in progress, Homicide, Suicide, House Fire

Priority 3 – Accident without Injuries, Intrusion Alarms, DOA, Disturbance in progress, DWI, Prowler

Priority 4 – Funeral Escorts, Curfew Violation, Loud Party, Prostitution

Priority 5 – Burglary already occurred, Disturbance already occurred, Forgery already occurred

Priority 6 – Parking complaint, Fireworks complaint, Gas Theft, Loose Animal

FEDERAL & STATE GRANT STATUS

2012 JAG Grant: Expires 09/30/2015

In conjunction with Miller County, the Department was awarded the 2012 JAG Grant. The total funding associated with this grant—which is administered through the Department of Justice—is \$33,600. Because the Department of Justice requires the City to split the grant with Miller County, the City received \$20,000. The Department intends to apply these funds towards the purchase one (1) new Chevrolet Caprice police vehicle with the City's portion of the grant.

2011 JAG Grant: Expires 09/30/2014

In conjunction with Miller County, the Department was awarded the 2011 JAG Grant. The total funding associated with this grant—which is administered through the Department of Justice—is \$46,634. Because the Department of Justice requires the City to split the grant with Miller County, the City is projected to receive \$32,650. The Department intends to purchase two (2) new Crown Victoria police vehicles with the City's portion of the grant.

2012 DOJ Bulletproof Vest Grant: Expires 08/31/2013

This grant pays one half of purchase cost of bullet proof body armor for police officers. National Institute of Justice Standards (BJA/NIJ) recommends that body armor be replaced every five years and the agency provides body armor for every officer and replaces it according to NIJ replacement recommendations. This year's grant will cover half of the cost of approximately 18 vests for a total of \$6,381.00.

2012-2013 DWI Traffic Enforcement Grant:

Expires 09/30/13

This grant pays overtime for DWI, speed, and occupant protection enforcement. The Federal amount is \$81,500. We have an in-kind local match of \$81,500 from the regular police budget. Local match (in-kind) uses a salary off-set from one of the patrol officers assigned to the Special Operations Traffic Section, a portion of the DWI / STEP Sergeant's salary and a



portion of the Department's vehicle maintenance cost utilizing a calculation based upon mileage. This program started in 1991 and has been funded for approximately 18 years. This grant overlaps our budget year due to the State of Arkansas being on a different fiscal year.

2012-2013 STOP Violence Against Women Act Grant: Expires 09/30/13



This grant pays the full salary of a police investigator to investigate all cases involving violent crimes committed against women. The grant also pays the salary for a police liaison position (case coordinator). The state amount is \$80,784.44, and the local in-kind match is \$27,059.62 for a total grant package of \$107,844.06.

2012-2013 Texarkana Housing Authority General Fund Officer Positions: Expires 11/31/13

The Texarkana Housing Authority's (THA) share is \$130,000.00, which covers the costs associated with the salaries and fringe benefits for two police officer positions. The two police officers who are assigned to THA are primarily responsible for police services within the Texarkana Housing Authority property. All compensation to the City will be made on a cost reimbursement basis.

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
